1. Check-in: All is well; everyone busy, but grateful; prayers for all who occasionally have rough days at work

2. Meeting Minutes:

- a. Review and vote on the meeting minutes for March and April (discuss highlighted sections)
 - Vote: AM motioned to accept the March 2024 meeting minutes with one correction, EW seconded; the vote passed unanimously with no abstentions.
 - **Vote:** EW motioned to accept the April 2024 meeting minutes as written, LA seconded; the vote passed unanimously with no abstentions.

3. Financial Report (vote)

- a) Statement of Activity (March May 2024)
 - Total revenue shows a loss- in proportion to income
 - CSAC will be reimbursed from NED grant for operating expenses (ED's pay, insurance, office expenses)
 - ED to make recommendations to reduce software & app costs (Finance Committee mtg)
- b) Statement of Financial Position (March May 2024)
 - ED contacted 4 persons regarding 2023 audit (including VP referral to accountant) and all CPA are busy; CSAC may only need a compilation not formal audit – in the process of securing CPA

Vote: IW motioned to accept the statement of financial position as well as the statement of activity for March to May 2024, RM seconded; the motion passed unanimously with no abstentions.

- c) Grants Update (ED) (vote)
 - Buhl: Predevelopment: Phase 2 ESA / Design Development (submitted 05/22/2024)
 - GEDTF grant: Phase 1 land transfers (needs to be executed)
 - NED: invoices to be submitted ASAP, PACE Assessments (received from 2 directors)
 - GTRP: Greenway Trails Recreation Program (ED met with the City, requests board approval)
 - i) would be used to expand the Perry South greenway beyond Harlan Ave entry
 - ii) Real Design shared probable construction cost estimate- \$208,537.50 budget
 - iii) ED requested permission to use \$100 from the greenway budget for application fee

Vote: EW motioned to apply for GTRP grant with the \$100 application fee, IW seconded; the vote passed unanimously with no abstentions.

- NeighborWorks: invited CSAC to apply for grant to support Dorothy Mae Richardson's home organization; CSAC must submit a proposal for use of funds
 - i) home repair program (proposed match from another nonprofit)
 - ii) health and wellness programs (trauma coping pilot: consultant & participant stipends)
 - ii) enhance and maintain greenspaces (Bright-Chuck, Greenway: stipends))

Vote: EW motioned to apply for the grant as described, SM seconded; the motion passed unanimously with no abstentions.

(1) EW motioned to amend these allocations to reflect including FHLB consultant, SM seconded; the motion passed unanimously with no abstentions.

- FHLB Consultant: w/ URA as CSAC project consultant for the affordable housing project Full Quiver Consulting provided a reduced fee using copy of application submitted in 2022
 -) RACP grant still an option; \$1M unlikely as first time applicant

4. Safety Report / 311 Concerns

a) No safety concerns were shared; AW is continuing to follow up on a vacant property with rats and raccoons that needs condemned and demolished; grass needs cut on City-owned vacant lots on development site- AW will follow-up with 311 requests for board to report to City
